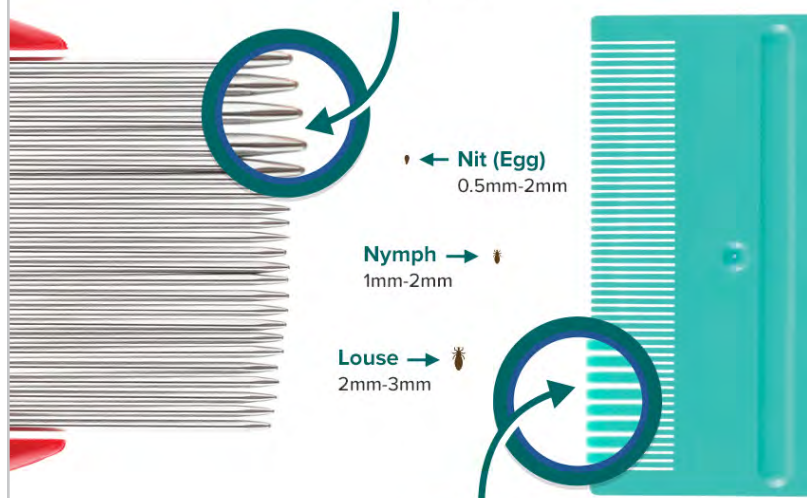

# What Nurses Need to Know About the Wet Combing Method

Did you know? It's the **comb**, not the chemicals, that gets rid of lice and nits. Wet combing is all about removing the live lice and the viable nits from the head. Simply removing the live lice is enough to kill them and removing the viable nits prevents them from hatching.

Remember, there is **no** pesticide or natural solution that can harm or kill nits. That means the **only** way to ensure that nits won't hatch and continue to spread is to physically remove them. And while it is low cost and safe, the wet combing method takes time and patience.

For the wet combing method, all you need is:

**Water** because lice freeze when wet, making it easier to capture and remove them.



**Conditioner** to lubricate the hair and make it much easier to comb through.



**WelComb®** to physically comb out lice and nits. With a gap between the teeth that's .15mm, it's small enough to capture even the smallest nit.
